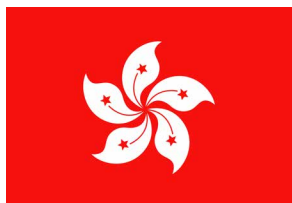
CHINA



China has given over **\$3.7 billion** to over **200** colleges and universities in the U.S., and over **42%** of that amount — or **\$1.57 billion** —has gone to **ten** schools alone:

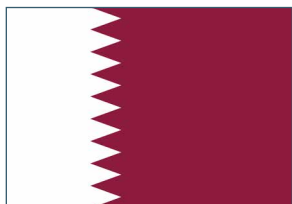
HONG KONG

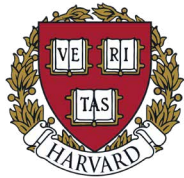


This oil-rich gulf state has poured over **\$6.25 billion** into U.S. colleges and universities, with **99%** of this colossal sum going to *only ten* schools:

10 SCHOOLS RAKE IN OVER \$20 BILLION IN FOREIGN CASH

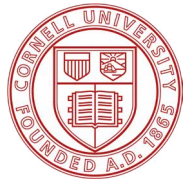
